<u>Project: Evaluation of IPPF Strategic framework 2016 – 2022 for Swedish International Development Cooperation Agency core funding</u>

1. Background	Overview of IPPF IPPF is a global service provider and leading advocate of sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) for all. IPPF is a worldwide movement of 119 nationally-owned Member Associations (MAs) and 29 collaborative partners, covering 149 countries in total. IPPF's mission is to lead a locally owned, globally connected civil society movement that provides and enables services and champions SRHR for all, especially the under-served, who may be denied access to rights and services.
2. Purpose	 The purpose of this assignment is to support IPPF to collect relevant data and provide subsequent analysis to evaluate the delivery of IPPF's Strategic Framework 2016 – 2022. The following conditions will apply: The evaluation shall conform to OECD/DAC's Quality Standards for Development Evaluation. The evaluators shall use the Sida OECD/DAC Glossary of Key Terms in Evaluation. The evaluation should be utilisation-focused, i.e. put emphasis on who the intended users of a specific evaluation are and the intended use of the evaluation. The evaluation process shall be designed, conducted and reported to meet the needs of the intended users.
3. Roles and responsibilities	 Contractor's specific roles and responsibilities include: Conduct the evaluation as per SIDA guidelines based on relevant documents from IPPF. This might include virtual/in person interviews with selected colleagues and focus group discussions. The methodology will be mutually agreed. Produce a report of the evaluation with relevant data analysed and interpreted to support the findings along with recommendations if any.
